Focus: Do I qualify for the Oregon Health Plan?

Columbia Pacific CCO is one of Oregon's coordinated care organizations (CCOs), providing physical, dental and mental health care and substance use treatment through the Oregon Health Plan (OHP). **You may qualify for OHP based on your income or other factors.**

Do I qualify?

As of March 2025, here are some examples of people who apply for OHP:

A couple who makes less than **\$2,433** per month

Four children whose parent/guardian make less than **\$8,172** per month

A pregnant person who makes less than **\$2,478** per month

The best way to find out if you qualify is to apply!

Ways to apply

What you need to apply (for all household members)



Birthdate (birth certificate, if available)



Social Security number (if you have one, not required)



Income and deduction information (for example, pay stubs)



Immigration documentation (if applicable)



Information about health insurance available to you through an employer (if any)

When you need to apply

To keep your OHP coverage, **you may need to reapply every 12 months.** This is sometimes called “redetermination.” OHP will send you a letter about how to do this.

When people talk about Medicaid in Oregon, you may hear them say a lot of different names or letters. That's because there are many organizations involved in making sure you get the care you deserve. How can you make sense of it all?

It helps to think of Medicaid in Oregon like a pyramid

Oregon Health Authority (OHA) runs the Medicaid program for the entire state of Oregon, which is called the Oregon Health Plan (OHP). Oregon residents apply to OHA for Medicaid coverage through OHP. OHA then assigns members to a coordinated care organization (CCO).

Columbia Pacific CCO is what's called a coordinated care organization (CCO). Oregon's CCOs exist to provide health insurance and much more. We look at the broad picture of your health and help with other services you wouldn't expect from a health care company. We also work with community partners to give you access to better health.

Your primary care provider (PCP) might be a doctor, a nurse practitioner, a physician's assistant or a naturopath. They coordinate your care with Columbia Pacific CCO and other medical team members like dentists, mental health providers, pharmacists and others.
